<u>Arkansas Department</u> of Education:

"Gifted and talented children and youth are those of high potential or ability whose learning characteristics and high educational needs require qualitatively differentiated educational experiences and services.

Possession of these talents and gifts, or the potential for their development, will be evidenced through an interaction of above-average intellectual ability, task commitment and/or, motivation and creative ability."

Identification Procedures

- Referral: Anyone may refer a student for screening (teacher, parent, relative, peer, administrator, counselor, self-nomination, etc.). Referrals are accepted in grades 3-12 at any time throughout the school year.
- 2. Permission to Test: Before the screening process can begin, a parent/guardian signature must be obtained to grant permission for screening.
- Screening: The screening process for each student includes any or all of the following as stated in 7.0 of the Arkansas Gifted and Talented Program Approval Standards: Use of at least two objective and two subjective measures (one of which must assess creativity) will be used for placement decisions.

- 4. Identification: Once objective and subjective information has been gathered and data has been quantified, the data is recorded on a "Profile Sheet". The GT Placement Committee (comprised of GT Specialists, classroom teachers, counselor, building administrator, and GTDirector) will meet and using a blind identification process (profile is identified by number only; no student names are given during the placement process) make a decision on the best educational placement for a referred student. No single criterion or cut-off score is used to include or exclude a student from the GT program.
- 5. **Notification:** When the Placement Committee has made the best educational placement decision for a student who has been referred, the parents/guardians are notified of the committee decision. If the decision is made to place a student in the GT program, a parent/quardian must give written permission before a student can be officially placed into the program. If a student is not placed it is due to the committee's decision that the student's needs can best be served in the general classroom. If a parent/guardian has questions regarding the decision of the Placement Committee, they are asked to contact the GT Director. An annual review is completed for GT students at the end of each school year which provides documentation for the continuation of services. The GT Director monitors GT students' grades every nine weeks.





Programming Options When Placed:

- Students in grades K-2 are served through Whole Group Enrichment lessons.
- Grades 3-6 are served through a pull-out class that meets a minimum of 150 minutes per week with a certified GT Specialist.
- Grades 7-8 are served through Honors courses or by choosing to take a GT elective class facilitated by a certified GT Specialist. Students may take both.
- Grades 9-12 are served through choosing to take Honors and/or Advanced Placement (AP) courses.
