## What is the Interpretation of AP Exam Scores?

- 5 = VERY WELL QUALIFIED
- 4 = WELL QUALIFIED
- 3 = QUALIFIED
- 2 = POSSIBLY QUALIFIED
- 1 = No RECOMMENDATION

Beebe High School Advanced Placement is a program that offers advanced content, exam prep, and earns the student a weighted grade toward their GPA. A student who participates in an AP course for an entire year, maintains a passing grade, and sits for the end of year AP exam their GPA will be as follows: A=5 (instead of 4), B=4, C=3, etc.

## WHAT IS ADVANCED PLACEMENT?

The Beebe School district has a long history of commitment to excellence. In 2013 and 2014 Beebe School District was named to the 4th and 5th Annual Advanced Placement District Honor Roll. Beebe Schools was one of 477 districts around the country and Canada that were honored by College Board for increasing coursework while maintaining or increasing the percentage of students who earned 3 or higher on AP exams.

Advanced placement courses give academically talented (GT identified and non-identified) students the opportunity to take college-level courses while in high school. Beebe AP instructors use college-level materials and a course syllabus audited by the National College Board. AP courses provide students with a more rigorous curriculum that reflects courses taught in colleges throughout the country. If a student has completed their year-long AP course(s), they are required to take the AP exam for the course(s) administered by BHS under the supervision of College Board. Depending on the scores attained on these exams, students may earn college credit from colleges/universities. This is a potential money saver for parents and students.

## AP Benefits

- Students who take AP courses and exams are much more likely to graduate from college in four years.
- AP courses can shorten a student's stay at college or even allow for a double major.
- Success in AP courses builds skills and confidence.
- Colleges/Universities look at student's applications. Students who have taken AP courses are signaling they are serious about their education.
- Tuition money can be saved by successfully completing AP courses and AP exams.



## Honor Graduates at Beebe High School

*Exact information and requirements for Honors Graduates can be found in the Student Handbook.*

**Honors Recognition** - Earn 10 academic credits from the courses listed - must include 3 AP courses; and earn 2 academic credits of the same foreign language.

**Highest Honors** - GPA of 4.0 and above with 3 of the 10 courses listed being AP.

**Honors** - GPA of 3.50-3.99 with the of the 10 courses listed being AP.

All courses plus any AP class that is not considered a core course (ex. AP Studio Art), are used to figure GPA when determining honor graduate status.

*Students working working ward HONORS or HIGHEST HONORS must choose 10 courses from the courses listed, 3 of which must be AP courses. Students must **also** take 2 year of the same foreign language for a total of 12 courses.*
